ENTRY FEES AND DEADLINES

Late Entry	After September 14, 2010	\$100 per head

Online entries will not be available after August 16, 2010.

Entry fees include bedding and tie-out space. Bedding will be available upon arrival at World Beef Expo. Exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding for tie-outs.

All exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with the General Rules & Regulations. Rules have been revised for the 2010 World Beef Expo.

Rules Specific to the Prospect Show and Sale

- Entry Information.** The entry fee is \$80 per animal if paid by September 14th. This fee includes bedding and entry into the Prospect Show and Sale. A \$50 sale credit will be given to all entries that go through the sale ring. The Prospect Entry Form must be used for all Prospect Show and Sale entries.
- Entry Requirements.** The Prospect Show and Sale is open to all heifers and steers born January 1, 2010 or later. All sale entries must show in the Prospect Show on Saturday, September 25th. Calves must be fitted and broke to lead. Entries must be of show quality and must show evidence of the ability to grow and take on additional weight and finish. Cattle entered in this division must be marketable show prospects, free of lump jaw, blindness, ringworm and warts. They must be sufficiently healed from dehorning and/or castration, if applicable. Animals entered in the Prospect Show and Sale may also be entered in the Open Show.
- Health Requirements.** Every sale animal must have an interstate health certificate. (If the animal is sold outside of Wisconsin, this can be re-signed and used as an interstate health form.) **Without this certificate, the animal will not be allowed to participate in the Prospect Show and Sale.** Each animal needs an official metal tag ID or a tattoo. All cattle are subject to veterinary inspection.
- Check-In.** Cattle will be weighed and processed between noon and 2 p.m. on Friday, September 24th. World Beef Expo identification will be furnished when cattle are checked in. No re-weighs are permitted. Once an animal crosses the scale, it is committed to both the Prospect Show and the Prospect Sale.
- Stalling.** Upon arrival, Prospect Show and Sale animals may be stalled anywhere on the World Beef Expo grounds. The Prospect Committee will provide signage and identification to indicate that an animal is a Prospect entry. **ALL PROSPECT ENTRIES MUST BE IN THE PROSPECT BARN BY 10:00 A.M. ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW.**
- Show.** All sale entries must be shown in the Prospect Show on Saturday, September 25th. Show order will be heifers followed by steers. Cattle will be shown by breed if three (3) head or more are entered in that breed. Classes will be determined based on weight, and the lightest classes will show first. After champions are selected, all animals must return to the show ring for the selection of sale order.
- Sale.** The top 40 animals will sell. This will be made up of the top 20 heifers and the top 20 steers, unless numbers require otherwise. Selection and sale order will be determined by the judge(s). All animals in the sale are subject to a commission fee. A halter must remain on the calf after the sale. The transfer of registration papers is the responsibility of the seller. Payment will be made to the consignor within 30 days of the sale. Animals sold on the Prospect Sale to a junior exhibitor may be entered in the World Beef Expo Junior Show.
