Online entries will not be available after August 16, 2010.

Entry fees include bedding and tie-out space. Bedding will be available upon arrival at World Beef Expo. Exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding for tie-outs.

All exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with the General Rules & Regulations. Rules have been revised for the 2010 World Beef Expo.

Rules Specific to the Limousin Show

1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF).
2. All animals must be 75% Limousin or greater, as indicated by registration certificate. High percentage and purebred Limousin cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships. Registered Limflex animals shall compete in Limflex classes only.
3. All animals must be properly recorded in the name of the exhibitor by the entry deadline. Cattle must be entered in the exact same name that appears on the registration certificate as the current owner.
4. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the corresponding registration certificate.
5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation rules shall be enforced, and the Limousin Association of Wisconsin reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting, according to NALF rules, includes the following:
 - a. Any altering of the natural color of the animal by use of dyes, paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances.
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair-like substance, including false tailheads and false polls. (False tail switches are allowed.)
 - c. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or beneath the hide, or removal of tissue, in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal.
 - d. The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the natural conformation.
 - e. Any attempts to disrupt or change the normal dental development of the animal.
 - f. Any products/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal are prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally – which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus). EXCEPTIONS: In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids and/or electrolytes administered by the licensed official World Beef Expo veterinarian with the approval of the show committee of the Limousin Association of Wisconsin. This exception is not applicable on show day or check-in day.
6. All bulls must show with a nose lead. World Beef Expo reserves the right to disqualify from show any animal that is deemed unmanageable or dangerous.

7. All protests against exhibitors or individual animals dealing with age or genetic background of show cattle must be submitted in writing and signed by three (3) Limousin Association of Wisconsin members and presented to World Beef Expo management within 12 hours of the completion of the Limousin Show.
8. North American Limousin Foundation and the Limousin Association of Wisconsin reserve the right to mouth animals to inspect dental development.
9. There are no limitations as to color or color markings of Limousin show cattle.

GROUP CLASSES

Group classes will be entered at the show.

All group class animals must be exhibited in an individual class.

Open to cattle 75% Limousin or greater. Limflex cattle are not eligible for group classes.

Pair of Heifers: Two heifers, any age, owned by one exhibitor

Pair of Bulls: Two bulls, any age, owned by one exhibitor

Best Three Head: Three head, one or both sexes, owned by one exhibitor

Best Five Head: Five head, one or both sexes, owned by one exhibitor

Get-of-Sire: Three animals, one or both sexes, sired by the same bull and owned by one exhibitor

Produce of Dam: Two animals, one or both sexes, by the same female and owned by one exhibitor
