### ENTRY FEES AND DEADLINES

Early Entry – Online	August 16, 2010	\$60 per head

Late Entry	September 1, 2010	\$80 per head
Late Late Entry	After September 1, 2010	\$100 per head

*Online entries will not be available after August 16, 2010.*

Entry fees include bedding and tie-out space. Bedding will be available upon arrival at World Beef Expo. Exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding for tie-outs.

*All exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with the General Rules & Regulations.  
Rules have been revised for the 2010 World Beef Expo.*

### Rules Specific to the Other Registered Cattle Shows

1. This division has been created to allow all breeds of beef cattle to be exhibited at World Beef Expo. If a breed is not otherwise listed on the Open Show entry information, animals may be entered in the Other Registered Cattle division.
2. **Each individual breed will have its own individual show.** All Open Show breeds, regardless of the number of entries, will show individually and recognize their own champions.
3. **Fewer than ten entries:** Any breed show with fewer than ten paid entries will have its champion(s) eligible for Any Other Breed (AOB) champion. The AOB champion in each division – heifer, bull, cow/calf pair – will then qualify for the Supreme Champion Drive.  
**Ten or more entries:** Any breed show with ten or more paid entries will have its champion(s) automatically eligible for the Supreme Champion Drive.  
*See Rule 12 in the World Beef Expo General Rules & Regulations for more details.*
4. Each animal being shown must be registered with the appropriate breed organization, and the original registration certificate must be made available for inspection. Each animal must have a legible tattoo that corresponds with its registration certificate.
5. Animals must be fitted in an ethical manner. Unethical fitting is grounds for disqualification. Unethical fitting includes, but is not limited to, the following:
  - a. Altering the natural color of the animal through the use of dyes, paints, hair-coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances.
  - b. The addition of any hair or hair-like substance, including false tail heads and false polls. False tail switches are allowed.
  - c. The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or beneath the hide, or removal of tissue, in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal.
  - d. The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the natural conformation.
  - e. Any attempts to disrupt or change the normal dental development of the animal.
  - f. Any products/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally – which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus).  
**EXCEPTIONS:** In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids and/or electrolytes administered by the licensed official World Beef Expo veterinarian with the approval of the show management.

6. Each individual breed show is subject to the rules and regulations of a state and/or national breed association to which the breed and its exhibitors belong.
7. There will be no group classes for breeds in the Other Registered Cattle divisions.
8. World Beef Expo reserves the right to split or combine classes as necessary.
