Online entries will not be available after August 15, 2011.

Entry fees include bedding and tie-out space. Bedding will be available upon arrival at World Beef Expo. Exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding for tie-outs.

All exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with the General Rules & Regulations. Rules have been revised for the 2011 World Beef Expo.

Rules Specific to the Maine-Anjou Show

1. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). When entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the AMAA, as well as the rules of show management. Entries found to be misrepresented or persons not abiding by the show rules may be disqualified from showing.
2. All animals must be registered in the AMAA, and the original registration certificate must be available for inspection at the time of check-in.
3. All animals, except Mainetainer heifers, must be 75% Maine-Anjou or greater.
4. The AMAA recognizes heifers sired by non-Maine-Anjou bulls to be eligible to show in the Mainetainer division. This division recognizes heifers that range from 25% to 74% Maine-Anjou blood.
5. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and must correspond exactly with the registration certificate. Other than a brucellosis/calfhood vaccination tattoo, there shall be no permanent identification mark(s) other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
6. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, with the exception of dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
7. The use of false tailheads, adding hair, or adding any other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
8. The dyeing or artificial changing of the existing color pattern is prohibited.
9. All animals over seven (7) months of age must be dehorned.
10. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification and/or detection of foreign substances.
11. Bulls ten (10) months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead.
12. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
13. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
14. All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle also will be made available for examination to be mouthed for the purpose of age verification. The show committee reserves the right, after mouthing by a qualified veterinarian, to remove an animal from the show or designate the animal to be shown in a different class from the previously entered. An animal shall remain

in the same class as placed in at the time of mouthing for the remainder of the show season, considered to be June 1 to May 31. The exhibitor shall have the opportunity to have the animal re-mouthed at his/her own expense for future shows. The selection of the individual to do the mouthing shall be at the discretion of the AMAA Show Committee.

15. Exhibitors shall wear a show harness to display entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA-sponsored shows.
16. Classes of 16 or more animals shall be split by show management as equally as possible.

GROUP CLASSES

Group classes will be entered at the show.

All group class animals must be exhibited in an individual class.

Both Mainetainer and Maine-Anjou animals are eligible for group classes.

Breeder's Herd: Three head, both sexes represented. All individual cattle in an entry must carry the same herd prefix, but can be owned individually by immediate family members.

Produce of Dam: Two animals from the same dam. Dam information must be supplied before entry into class.

Get-of-Sire: Three head of any age, both sexes represented, all by one sire.

Best Four Head: Four head, any age, owned or co-owned by one exhibitor.
