Online entries will not be available after August 15, 2011.

Entry fees include bedding and tie-out space. Bedding will be available upon arrival at World Beef Expo. Exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding for tie-outs.

All exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with the General Rules & Regulations.

Rules have been revised for the 2011 World Beef Expo.

Rules Specific to the Pinzgauer Show

1. All entries must be registered with the American Pinzgauer Association (APA), and all exhibitors must be members of the APA. All entries must be purebred or fullblood Pinzgauer, must be red and solid-faced, have a white underbelly, and a predominately white tail, and have a legible tattoo that matches its registration certificate. Tattoos will be checked and verified by an APA official and/or World Beef Expo superintendent at the show. All entries will be subject to sifting for correctness or papers and suitability to show. Animals with a frame score of three (3) or less may be disqualified.
2. Animals will enter the show ring in ascending order according to age, youngest to oldest.
3. Show management reserves the right to split or combine classes as necessary.
4. All bulls twelve (12) months of age or older must have a nose ring or nose lead when out of the stall.
5. In the cow/calf class, the calf may not be more than 240 days of age when shown. Calves more than 120 days old must be registered with the APA. The calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the cow must be lactating.
6. Surgical or non-surgical alteration of an animal is prohibited, with the exception of dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation and color.
7. Tails are not to be balled for the show. No artificial filling with liquids, air or any other substance is allowed.
8. Entries in classes 13-15 must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian.
9. Entries in classes 32-37 must be accompanied by a satisfactory semen evaluation signed by a licensed veterinarian if offered for sale at World Beef Expo.
10. Special class: Premier Sire. To qualify, a minimum of three (3) offspring of the bull must be shown, with both sexes represented. There is no requirement regarding who owns the bull. The award will be calculated based on the six highest ranking animals sired by each eligible bull.

GROUP CLASSES

Pair of Females: Two females, owned by one exhibitor

Pair of Bulls: Two bulls, owned by one exhibitor

Produce of Dam: Two animals with the same genetic dam, at least one owned by exhibitor

Junior Get-of-Sire: Three animals by one sire, both sexes represented, from classes 1-10 and 23-32, at least two owned by exhibitor

Get-of-Sire: Three animals by one sire, both sexes represented, at least two owned by exhibitor

Breeder's Herd: Four animals, both sexes represented, all bred by exhibitor, at least two owned by exhibitor
